## **II. Topics for CCCCIO consideration/discussion:**

Primarily the meeting was related to information dissemination. I found and agree with discussions of multiple constituency groups identifying current legislation and over regulation as the most significant barriers to implementation of many of our college initiatives. Suggestions were made by current college presidents such as to “blow up” the current funding model to solve our problems.

## **III. Top Three Takeaway Items:**

- 1) Refresh 10 Statewide Sectors:
  - a. Removing “logistics” from Global Trade and moving it to Advance Transportation & Logistics
  - b. Removing the word “small” from business sector and changing to Business & Entrepreneurship
- 2) There is a goal on integrating K-12 metrics with LaunchBoard data into a combined dashboard at some point in the future.
- 3) CCCCO is working toward having NOVA be an integrated planning reporting system to include metrics and budget for all initiatives. Combining the budgets for Equity, Basic Skills, SSSP, and Strong Workforce is a conversation that CCCCIOs will want to be involved in shaping.
