In formulating its recommendations to the Board of Governors, the committee shall consult with all appropriate constituencies, and shall rely primarily on the advice and judgment of the Academic Senate. • advises the Chancellor’s Office on state-level curriculum certification processes to ensure quality, integrity, compliance, collaboration, flexibility, timeliness, and transparency, while putting the needs of students first. • works with the Chancellor’s Office to ensure that all levels of local and regional curricular design and approval is faculty-led and driven by identified student need. • advises the Chancellor’s Office on training programs for colleges and districts regarding submission of curriculum to the Chancellor’s Office.

Topics for CCCCIO consideration/discussion:

1 & 2 Automated Approval / Certification

The Chancellor's Office is working on the next memo for annual certification, which will include program certification along with credit course certification. Districts will need to make sure that local policies on awarding of credit are in place. The following can now be certified locally:

1. All credit courses
2. Modified credit programs
3. New credit programs with a local program goal with the exception of new CTE credit programs

This means that, *for colleges who have certified*, the only items the CO will be reviewing are the ADTs, new CTE programs and baccalaureate programs. If colleges do not certify, the CO will review all pieces of curriculum for that college.

3. CSU GE Breadth and IGETC Certificates of Achievement

The CO is proposing a new process for submitting these. The proposal is that CSU-GE-Breadth and IGETC Certificates of Achievement will not be required to include all of the general education courses that apply to the certificate in Item 3 of the Narrative. Instead, the program requirements table will consist of a sample course pattern for completion of the certificate to equal the total units required to satisfy the CSUGE or IGETC requirement (historically 37 or 39 units). Only the course outlines of record for these courses will be attached. ASSIST documentation is not required. Instead, a .pdf copy of the CSUGE Breadth or IGETC Transfer requirements from the current catalog will be attached to the proposal as a program document. *Note: This does not include the STEM*

patterns. Additionally, these certificates are not eligible for federal financial aid

6. Internships vs Cooperative Work Experience vs Apprenticeship

Cooperative Work Experience and Apprenticeship are both defined in statute. However, Internship is not defined and local definitions of it often blur into CWEE and Apprenticeship. 5C will work next year to create a definition of Internship.

8. Modifications to Report Delayed

9. AB 705 Update

Guidance for math pathway (statistics and liberal arts mathematics) is forthcoming. It will most likely mirror the guidance for English. It will hopefully come to the field before the Curriculum Institute.

10. RFA for Technology Projects include COCI and C-ID Technology

An RFA is going out for all of the projects at the Tech Center, even if they were produced by a vendor such as Hobson's Starfish. There is a chance that COCI may move to a different vendor or set of programmers. But, this won't be a setback because we own the code (unlike with Governet). The RFA opportunities are on the TRIS / Digital Futures website.

11. Update on COCI

COCI is the system of record for programs for MIS. COCI is the steward of the history and MIS is the owner of the control number. Half of the team is currently working on creating one owner for both. The other half of the team is working on the generation and storage of approval letters. Colleges should check to see what approval letters they have / don't have. Colleges can write a help ticket to Zen Desk if they cannot see the approval letters.

By curriculum institution, it's predicted that a 36 hour turn around time for control numbers will be in place, and approval letters will be working as expected. Most likely the SAVE button will not be fixed by then.
