I recall, back in the Midwestern days, we started a program called PROF (Professors of the Future) that recruited underrepresented faculty by discipline, supported some of their graduate studies, hired them PT & then FT with understanding that college would open a FT position timed to coincide with their gaining masters & 2 years' teaching experience. NO guarantee of hire, but in vastly increased our qualified pool of diverse candidates. That was at Parkland College in Champaign.
