

## Consultation Council 8.16.2012

**System Budget Request:** More focused than last year – 2 tiered request based on passage or no passage of Prop 30. Seeks COLA versus growth which some districts may not support, but we need dollars for students we currently serve and also need continued funding even if Prop 30 passes.

**Student Senate Update:** Currently there is a call for new BOG student member (2 year term).

**SSTF Update.** At this time no additional workgroups are planned; they are working on summary paper on status of SSTF recommendations which will be released soon.

- **Scorecard Update:** Patrick Perry provided an update and indicated he is in process of drafting a white paper which will be distributed within the next couple of weeks. The scorecard will include 6 metrics: 3 focusing on degree, certificate, and transfer; 1 on students in remedial courses for math, English & ESL; 1 on CTE; and 1 on CDCP – non-credit. System-level metrics, scorecard information, and details in the Datamart will be open to the public; unit record data files will be password protected. In the AARC reports, course completion will be eliminated as progress metric, but will be available in data mart. Because peer group benchmarking is required by Ed Code, the CCCCCO will produce a single analysis paper yearly, but the new metrics will focus more on individual college performance over time.
- **Enrollment Priority:** Enrollment Priority Registration regs going to BOG for final reading in September.
- **Professional Development:** The intent is to revitalize Professional Development (6.1 and 6.2) and now have a committee of 32 representatives from 23 organizations. Meeting scheduled 9/12-13 in Pomona and virtual meetings in October and November. LeBaron is currently doing literature review and collecting information from flex calendar reps.
- **Basic Skills Summit:** Established contents of “success strategies” document to be completed within 6 months and will include data, resources, and strategies – capture local work and resources.

**Government Relations:** Nothing new to report on legislation; update to be distributed. January starts new 2-year session so they will be convening the State Legislative Task Force Group (1/2 day meeting on 10/17 from 2-5pm)

**Proposition 30:** The CC sent a recommendation to the BOG that our system go on record as supporting even though Chancellor Scott has publically supported. Important for individuals to know that they cannot support both Prop 30 and the Munger proposition.

**Reestablishment of Accreditation Task Force:** CCCCCO had a task force in '09 on accreditation and it was recommended that it be reestablished to study why CA colleges appear to receive an increased number of sanctions and more severe sanctions than colleges in other parts of the country. After much discussion on the pros/cons of convening such as task force, it was

recommended that action be delayed until a new chancellor is hired. The findings from the last task force will be released to CC for discussion as a future agenda item.
