**Committee Charge:**

The Intersegmental Curriculum Workgroup (ICW) is composed of representatives from CCC and CSUS Academic Senates; counselors and transfer/articulation centers; CCC and CSU Chancellor's office representatives; ASCCC staff; and 1 administrator from CCC. The group serves as the curriculum workgroup for the implementation of SB 1440 degrees.

Disciplines Update

- ICT hasn't reconvened since vetting
- Child & Adolescent Development and Nutrition are close to being done
- Biology is vetting
- Engineering re-vetting
- Chemistry template won't be released until September 1; STEM for IGETC allows for postponement of 2 courses if needed

TMC Policies and Processes

- 1440 Benefits for High-Unit Degrees – Discussion with ENGR and NURS
- FDRG Leads
- Engineering –
    - Could potentially create an engineering degree for most program with the C-IDs that have been developed although some CSUs may have to create a bridge semester
    - Positive incentive for engineering students could potentially be bump in GPA (priority) since engineering is not impacted
  - Nursing – the nursing model curriculum was reviewed and discussed
    - What are the benefits – setting unit caps, admission benefits (priority [.2 GPA bump], not guarantee, for admission review)
    - Need to identify the incentives for CC nursing programs to revise their curriculum
  - TMC Criteria – Draft criteria for future development of TMCs, review of TMCs, and areas of emphasis so we can identify next steps
  - Research on Disciplines -
    - Communicative Disorders - more research on areas of emphasis
    - Nursing

- Engineering
- Hotel/Hospitality – conduct more research to see if there are subsets and consider implementing FDRG
- Family & Consumer Science – break out by subject areas to see if there are students beyond nutrition/dietetics
- Recreation Administration – CSUS 11 campuses, over 200 students; will not move forward at this time
- Public Administration/Political Science – CSUS 12 campuses; courses seem to match Business Administration TMC

MOU – reviewed draft MOU between Academic Senates. Need to develop an Evaluation Process of the effectiveness of the TMCs (begin first round of TMC evaluation in Fall 2014).

- IOC Report – discussed areas of emphasis and how they may not meet student needs; STEM area of emphasis has appeal
- CCCCO Report
  - Cris McCullough is the Interim Dean
  - 2000 programs and courses in the queue; 174 ADTs in the queue
  - 100% target at December 2014; 73% at this time
- CSU CO Report – progress distributed by e-mail; Chancellor’s office is trying to develop electronic process for all campuses; completion of verification by deadline appears to be an issue for students
