**Committee Charge:**

The Intersegmental Curriculum Workgroup (ICW) is composed of representatives from CCC and CSUS Academic Senates; counselors and transfer/articulation centers; CCC and CSU Chancellor's office representatives; ASCCC staff; and 1 administrator from CCC. The group serves as the curriculum workgroup for the implementation of SB 1440 degrees.

**Meeting Agenda Topics:**

Announcements

- UC announced approval of alternative IGETC path; still needs to be incorporated into the IGETC standards for approval, but will allow movement on degrees such as Chemistry

C-ID Advisory Structure Update

- Draft distributed; more discussion once formal partnership between CCC and CSU finalized

Discipline Updates and Discussion

- "ICW point person" will be assigned to each FDRG
- Kinesiology activity courses are being reviewed
- CTE and Non-transfer disciplines
  - Consider appointing CSUS discipline consultant to each of these groups (ex.: addiction studies; commercial music; allied health; emergency medical; culinary; transportation; biotech)
  - Look at disciplines for 'liberal learning'
  - CTE - CCCCCO focusing on degrees/certificates that lead to employment; will bring information to next meeting
- Status of Agriculture and Information Systems TMC
  - Ag is still vetting all 4 degree proposals
  - Information Systems – still discussion on IS vs ICT degree
    - IS - isn't much different from Business; will discuss at next meeting; probably stay with this degree pattern
    - ICT -- only at a 3 CSUs; CCC's can lay out curriculum and work individually with the CSU

TMC Processes

- TMC Development Cut-off Update
  - Committee will discuss where to go with the TMC model at next

meeting; will review updated CSU majors information

- Non-Substantive TMC Revisions
  - Document will be on agenda for approval next meeting
  - Evaluate proposals based on criticality and disruptiveness
  - Critical to inform the field of necessary response to change
- One TMC Per Discipline Policy - draft reviewed; back to committee for approval at next meeting
  - Process for 5 year review to be drafted for next meeting
- High-unit Model Curriculum
  - Nursing will re-vet
  - Engineering still having some issues with physics descriptors due to floating topics; engineering needs topics but not necessarily the series

#### C-ID Processes

- C-ID Course Review Process: Faculty Subgroup Recommendation
  - Draft process distributed; technology changes will need to be implemented so designee has access to all information

#### Reports

- • IOC Meeting Report
  - Discussion focused on SB440; may hit Assembly Ed Committee in early August OR potentially postponed until next year; Amendments have been sent by the 2 chancellor's office
  - CSU system has received approximately 626 ADT applicants and 425 transferred; some colleges expect significant increases in the future
- Faculty Coordinator Report – covered under IOC
- CCCCO Report
  - 761 approved degrees; 81 sent back for revisions; 80 in draft form at colleges -- 161 in the queue -- at 82% for June 2013
  - CCCCO working on data match on verifying actual degrees & transfers
  - MIS data has some quirks on reporting -- switching ADT to AD
- CSU CO Report -- ask for report on transfer degrees
  - Also recommend running the against clearinghouse
