1004. POLICY ON INSTITUTIONAL PLANNING

Reference: California Education Code 70902(b)(1)

Accreditation Standard 1.B

Title 5 Sections 51008, 51010, 51027, 53003, 54220, 55080, 55190, 55250, 55510, 56270 et seq.

The Superintendent-President shall ensure the District has and implements a broad-based comprehensive, systematic and integrated system of planning that involves appropriate segments of the college community and is supported by institutional effectiveness research. The planning system shall include plans required by law, including, but not limited to:

Long range educational or academic master plan, which shall be updated periodically as deemed necessary by the governing board

Facilities Plan

Faculty and Staff Diversity Plan

Student Equity Plan

Matriculation

Transfer Center

Cooperative Work Experience
EOPS

The Superintendent-President shall submit those plans for which Board approval is required by Title 5 to the Board.

The district performs program review of the accounting, general services, payroll, facilities and information technology functions and uses the results to improve processes. Employees rate their satisfaction as to the level of services provided and are given the opportunity to offer open-ended suggestions for improvement. They are also surveyed about their knowledge and use of online and other information related to these functions.
