Announcements

1. CSU counselor conferences will include information regarding Transfer majors. It will help inform counselors at CSU and high school counselors.
2. A grant has been given to CCC to assist in pushing out the first TMCs. This was granted to our state chancellors office through "Complete College America". This will assist in the assignment of CIDs, etc.

Discussion

1. SB292 - This Padilla bill focusses on the community college and says that CCs shall accept coursework from other CCs toward the AA-AS-T degree. There was a

great deal of discussion on the wording of the bill from both the CC academic senate and the CSU since it, as presently worded, opens up the possibility of students transferring without the proper courses as proposed in the TMC. The legislator is going to work on the wording.

2. High Unit Majors -At the preliminary exploration stages. The science folks are seeking assistance. STEM disciplines such as Chemical, physics, geology are being discussed.

3. We are looking at developing a total of 21 majors, although a lot of discussion will need to happen. nursing is not covered by SB 1440, but will be covered by AB1295.

4. Finalize guidance on auditions, portfolios, etc.

It looks like this is not an issue of admittance and therefore does not appear to be a problem for programs we have seen so far. CSU is not sure about music, art, and communication programs as far as admittance. Additionally, the impact of citizenship (nursing) and criminal records (teaching) needs to be looked at.

The LAO 's office is required to do a progress report on 1440 and another in 4 years to report on the impact of the bill.

Updates

1. American Institutions -- At the July meeting of CSU Board of Trustees, a decision was made to alter the American Ideals requirement. A waiver exists for CSU campuses to remove AI requirement. This removal requires that a CSU president seek that waiver through the BOT. This being done to accommodate 1440. CSU faculty are investigating this as an option. It is a way of getting CSUs to get to yes regarding 1440 rather than no we cannot do 1440 because we have too many requirements.

2. Status of AA-T and AS-T degrees - The Number of AA and AS Ts were reviewed. 49 colleges are compliant and 93 are currently being reviewed. When it comes to the number of proposals, 133 or 57% are approved, 92 or 39% are pending, and 10 or 4% are not submitted.

3. Status of Baccalaureate Degree similar mapping- CSU responses are positive to the first 4 TMC . Those CSUs that said no have until December to resolve their issues as prescribed by the CSU chancellor's office. The CSU Chancellor 's office has the authority to intercede. September 15 deadline for newly proposed TMCs.

4. Early SB 1440 student Identification - A small working group has been working on a way of allowing CSU to know early that a student is a AA/S T student is coming their way. Comments are that it needs to be simple and electronic. The desire is a timing issue and a workload issue for Ccs. Many CCs do not have electronic transcripts. CCC apply may need to be identified. Buy in from the CCC transfer directors needs to occur. The form needs to be electronic. It probably won't happen overnight. There may be funding that will allow those colleges that don't have e-transcripts to do implement e-transcripts. The CCC Chancellor is sponsoring a bill to

assure that all CCs do use e-transcripts.

5. Intersegmental Curriculum work group - Need for agreement between the systems regarding transferability as a whole.

6. Communication - Jeff Spano (CO) is working on a plan to inform counseling faculty and others about issues related to transfer with 1440. We talked about an organized effort, using various types of media, and making the public aware of the work done between CSU and CCC on behalf of our students. a subcommittee was formed to address the advertising.
