95811 a) Chancellor *Brice Harris* introduced *Denice Nolan*, newly appointed Acting Vice Chancellor of Student Services. She replaces *Linda Michalowski*, who recently retired.

b) *The 2014-2015 ACCCA Mentor Group* were in attendance to observe Consultation Council proceedings; each provided a self-introduction. 1. Student Senate Update: Student Representative Omar Paz provided a brief student report. No action items emerged. 2. Workforce Task Force (**Digest**): Chancellor Harris provided the update in Vice Chancellor Ton-Quinlivan's absence. Two town-hall meetings have been added in August to provide for input once the Task Force recommendations are published. The dates are published on the Task Force website. 3. Disabled Student Programs & Services Regulations Rewrite (**Digest**) (**Regulations**): A task force had been convened to update the title 5 regulations for DSPS, which were with one exception supported. The revised regs limit spending on facilities for ADA compliance to 1% of total DSPS allocations where none exist now. CEOs have a concern that this restriction is not solving any specific problem and will limit the flexibility of districts in serving disabled students. I asked if there was an issue with students not being served because a district has used DSPS funds to address an ADA facilities problem. The DSPS advocate indicated that he was not aware of any but was concerned about "outliers." The CC took the input under advisement. 4. State Budget Update (**Digest**): Vice Chancellor Dan Troy provided the report. The governor's budget proposal is very supportive of Community College initiatives. Two percent growth is in the budget proposal as well as base funding increase and a modest COLA. The discussion was lengthy and in-depth. The formula is still growth-centric, rather than an alternative that

can address funding needs of colleges that are not growing. **5. State Legislative Program Task Force Update (Digest) (State Update) (Senate Roster) (Assembly Roster) (Federal Update):** Vice Chancellor Vince Stewart provided a brief update. No action items emerged. **6. Other**

a) City College of San Francisco: good news from ACCJC with restoration status for City College.. They now have two years to address the recommendations. Control of the District now shifts back to the local Board of Trustees from the Board of Governors.

b) Bachelor's Degree: The colleges moving forward will be announced tomorrow if possible. The dialog with CSU and UC is still ongoing; Chancellor Harris predicts that some of the pilots will go forward, but not all 17 will do so. There were 34 applications initially. Chancellor Harris was surprised at the diversity of the list; overall, the applications were excellent. Only a few were not as clear or on point as they could have been, but have another opportunity in the future to revise and resubmit.
