#### **Committee Charge:**

The Intersegmental Curriculum Workgroup (ICW) is composed of representatives from CCC and CSUS Academic Senates; counselors and transfer/articulation centers; CCC and CSU Chancellor's office representatives; ASCCC staff; and 1 administrator from CCC. The group serves as the curriculum workgroup for the implementation of SB 1440 degrees.

#### **Meeting Agenda Topics:**

##### Discipline Updates and Discussion

- The Public Health Science degree will be released for review since it does not look at all like Allied Health/Exercise Science
- Information Technology is vetting descriptors
- Area of Emphasis (AOE) TMCs are scheduled for March in the following areas: Diversity Studies, Global and International Studies, Exercise Science/Allied Health, and Social Work
- FDRGs are scheduled or being scheduled for Basic Skills Reading, ESL, Math, and English
- CCC FDRG for biotechnology will be discussing descriptions

##### Model Curriculum

- Model Curriculum Workgroup (MCW) Update – the workgroup is 6 individuals from CCC; initial discussions recognized a need to make the curriculum for either certificate or degree; it may or may not be for transfer; if for transfer, then there would be obligation to drop local degree requirements; and if colleges develop, they must agree to reciprocity.
- Status of Information Technology (ISMC) – once done with vetting, the degree will move go back through the intersegmental review process before implementation by the MCW
- CSU should be included in each committee; if no discipline member can be identified by a deadline, then CCC discussion moves forward
- More work is needed to clarify the path for ISMCs; recommended that transfer GE pattern must be included, however, if cannot be completed with 60 units, then local graduation requirements must be waived

##### TMCs Policies and Processes

- TMC Review and Revision Criteria and Process document was reviewed; edits in process; revisions will be reconsidered at the next meeting
- TMC Development - An Overview of Discipline Selection document was reviewed; revisions will be reconsidered at the next meeting

##### CSU GE Breadth or IGETC Use on Chancellors Office Template

- There are questions in the field on whether or not colleges can grant a degree when the degree is approved for IGETC but students complete with CSU GE Breadth. This issue will be referred to SACC.

Chancellors Office Memo from January 28, 2015

- It is recommended that a final date for C-ID approval be identified since there are existing degrees that have not obtained their C-ID approval; the CCCCO will identify appropriate action

LAO Paper

- LAO paper compliments the faculty at the two systems on the work that has been done on transfer degrees; there is another report coming from the Campaign for College Opportunity which will most likely focus on the achievement gap

Music Theory Courses and CSU Transfer Credit

- CSU will be sending 3 course outlines as examples of music theory courses that can count for GE

Reports

- Senate Updates
  - ASCCC
    - ADT marketing presentation scheduled for plenary
    - Need discussion on how to clean up data which identifies students intending to complete ADT
    - RFP for new C-ID grant was distributed
  - ASCSU
    - There has been approximately 12,000 students transferring with degrees
    - Have been discussing baccalaureate degrees
  - IOC Report – the group needs to focus on marketing and data collection
- CCCCO Report
  - LAO is watching 440 development; 350 ADTs need state approval by August; colleges have to complete degrees if they have active or inactive degree in their inventory of the original 24 degrees; the degrees that are more difficult are Computer Science and Music; Elementary Teacher Education is often delayed because it doesn't have home
  - Met original 100% goal with over 1600 degrees approved
  - Jeff Spanos has a new position in CCCCO Institutional Effectiveness
- CSU CO Report
  - Discussions on way to reconfigure data from CSUs so data will probably come quarterly (similar/degrees/transfers); keep for frequent data on newer degrees
  - CSU legislative discussions include supporting funding student progress to degree, increased sections, student support services, and ADTs
  - TMCs lend themselves to the potential recognition of prior learning assessment, AP, or CLEP; may warrant future discussions

- Recommend agenda items of marketing and data collection
- Need to provide more history of agenda items due to turn over in membership
